# Information sheet for travellers from abroad

Dear travellers, welcome to Berlin! Together with you, our important task is to prevent SARS-CoV-2 from continuing to spread unnoticed.

This information sheet is for three different groups:

- Travellers from risk areas
- Travellers from other areas
- Travellers showing symptoms indicating they might be infected with SARS-CoV-2

# Travellers from risk areas with an elevated number of SARS-CoV-2 infections:

If you have been in a risk area during the 14-day period before entering Berlin, you are legally obligated to be tested for SARS-CoV-2 within 72 hours after your arrival. You can find an up-to-date list of risk areas on the website of the Robert Koch Institute (RKI): https://www.rki.de/DE/Content/InfAZ/N/Neuartiges\_Coronavirus/Risikogebiete\_neu.html

### Test obligation

- If you come from a risk area, you are legally obligated to get tested for SARS-CoV-2 within 72 hours.
- The test is free of charge.

## After the test

You have to quarantine yourself until you receive the test result!

#### Test result is positive

- The local health office or the Corona App will inform you about the test result.
- The quarantine remains in place.
- The local health office will contact you and inform you of what to do.
- The duration of the quarantine is determined by the local health office.

Test result is negative

- Tests are a snapshot of a moment in time. At the time of testing you were not ill with COVID-19.
- A 2nd test after 5-7 days is strongly recommended. It is also free of charge.
- There are no restrictions for you after notification of the final test result.

#### Travellers from countries that are not classified as risk areas:

You are coming from any area where the incidence of SARS-CoV-2 is less than 50 newly infected persons per 100,000 inhabitants within the past week?

Testing

- > There is no obligation for you to get tested.
- However, you have the possibility to get tested free of charge.
- > The test is free of charge.

After the test

You do not have to quarantine yourself before receiving the test result.

Test result is positive

- > The local health office or the Corona App will inform you about the test result.
- You must go into quarantine immediately.
- The local health office will contact you and inform you of what to do.
- > The duration of the guarantine is determined by the local health office.

Test result is negative

- Tests are a snapshot of a moment in time. At the time of testing you were not ill with COVID-19.
- ➤ A 2nd test after 5-7 days is strongly recommended. It is also free of charge.

#### Travellers showing symptoms indicating they might be infected with SARS-CoV-2:

You have the following symptoms: cough, fever, stuffy nose, impaired sense of smell or taste, sore throat, and/or difficulty breathing?
